- Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from an educational institute accredited by the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association or successful completion of the North American Veterinary Licensing Exam (NAVLE)

- Experience in the interpretation of hematology, clinical chemistry, cytology, urinalysis, endocrinology and other pertinent laboratory results
- Experience and/or aptitude for developing laboratory policies; standard operating protocols and tests development as well as surgical biopsy experience would be an asset
- Experience practicing veterinary medicine with livestock (e.g. cattle, pigs) and companion animals (e.g. dogs, cats)
- Advanced training and/or experience in veterinary medicine with animal welfare, animal behaviour/ ethology, infectious disease, disease control, epidemiology, regulatory veterinary medicine and/or veterinary public health
- Experience diagnosing and treating disease conditions of livestock and companion animals
