Dear Minister,

The Canadian Veterinary Medical Association (CVMA) is the national body representing the interests of the veterinary community in Canada. We congratulate you and your colleagues in the Public Health Agency of Canada on the release of Canada's *COVID-19 Immunization Plan: Saving Lives and Livelihood* on December 8, 2020.

As a key stakeholder in animal health, food security, and public health, the CVMA appreciates the complexity of the effort to protect Canadians from COVID-19 through immunization and acknowledges the importance of acting expeditiously to protect vulnerable and high-risk populations with what is expected to be an initially limited supply of vaccines. In this regard, we are pleased to note that Canada's COVID-19 Immunization Plan will rely on expert advice as the basis for federal/provincial/territorial government decisions on priority groups for immunization.

Canadian veterinary practitioners are the only professionals who are qualified to treat and diagnose disease in animals, including zoonotic disease. Soon after the pandemic struck in 2020, veterinary services were deemed essential by provinces and territories through legislation or effectively so through policy. The rationale for these decisions included the knowledge that the work of farm animal practitioners working in tandem with producers directly supports public health, food safety, food security, and animal welfare. Also, companion animal practitioners work to protect the health and welfare of pets and thereby help protect Canadians from diseases such as rabies. An important additional factor in the current situation is that pets are known to support the mental health of their owners during times of stress.
