FEATURED SPEAKERS



Serge Chalhoub, DVM, DACVIM (SAIM) - Telemedicine and Cats, Kidneys, and Bladders

Dr. Serge Chalhoub graduated from the Faculté de médecine vétérinaire (FMV) of the Université de Montréal in 2004. He followed this with a one-year rotating small animal clinical internship at the same institution before pursuing a residency in small animal internal medicine at the Animal Medical Center (AMC) in New York City. He stayed on at the AMC as their first renal/hemodialysis fellow and then as a staff doctor. Dr. Chalhoub has been a faculty member at the University of Calgary's Faculty of Veterinary Medicine since 2012. He was the recipient of the 2013 and 2021 Canadian Veterinary Medical Association's Teacher of the Year Award, the 2015 University of Calgary Team Teacher of the Year Award, and the 2017 Carl J. Norden Distinguished Teacher Award. He has authored and co-authored numerous scientific articles and book chapters on veterinary point of care ultrasound, renal, and urinary medicine, and lectures around the world on these topics.



Linda Crews, DVM — Medical Record Keeping

Dr. Linda Crews graduated from Ontario Veterinary College at Guelph University in 1997. She is a small animal veterinarian with a special interest in integrative medicine and is also a medical records enthusiast. Dr. Crews worked for the College of Veterinarians of Ontario for nine years as a medical records reviewer while practising in a variety of clinical environments. After moving to BC in 2009, she began to work with the CVBC as a complaints investigator. This experience, combined with her studies at the JIBC, directed her focus toward teaching practitioners how to create better medical records, use them to support their practice, and elevate the quality of the medical care their team provides. Dr. Crews is dedicated to her patients, her clients, and her peers, and she uses her medical records to teach exemplary care. When she is not working, she can often be found outdoors, with food, friends, and family.



Allison Foster, DVM, DACVD – Dermatology

Dr. Allison Foster is a board-certified veterinary dermatologist who operates the WCVM Veterinary Medical Centre's veterinary dermatology clinical services. Dr. Foster was born and raised in New Orleans, Louisiana, and received her Bachelor of Arts in English Literature from the University of New Orleans. She then attended Louisiana State University School of Veterinary Medicine and received her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine in 2004. Following graduation, Dr. Foster moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico, where she worked as a general practitioner for several years before deciding to pursue specialty training. Dr. Foster completed a small animal medicine and surgery rotating internship at VCA Veterinary Care Animal Hospital and Referral Center and then completed a three-year dermatology residency at Iowa State University and the University of Tennessee. She became a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Dermatologists in 2014.



Odette O, DVM, DACVAA – Anaesthesia

Dr. Odette O graduated from the University of Guelph (2001) with a Bachelor of Science in Biology. She earned her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the University of Guelph. Ontario Veterinary College (2004). After several years spent in small animal general practice, Dr. 0 completed her residency in Anesthesia and Pain Management at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and became board-certified in anaesthesia and analgesia (2013). Dr. 0 believes anaesthesiology is as much an art as it is a science. Being able to assess each patient individually and formulate a plan that best suits their specific needs is both the challenge and the beauty of anaesthesiology. The chance to be an integral part of the care team to support both the needs of the patient as well as fellow specialists is truly rewarding to her. Her anaesthesia-related interests include the practical aspects of clinical anaesthesia and pain management, as well as anaesthesia of unusual species and acupuncture. She completed the International Academy of Veterinary Medical Acupuncture course in 2012, then the CuraCore Advanced Acupuncture Course in 2022. Dr. O prides herself in optimizing patient care and also enjoys teaching anaesthesia-related topics to students, technicians, and fellow veterinarians. Dr. 0 is currently the Assistant Medical Director at SAGE Veterinary Centers, Dublin, and is also an active member of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesia and Analgesia including serving as a member of the board of directors and numerous other committees over the years.

Katherine Pankratz, DVM, DACVB – Undetected Pain and Subsequent Behaviour Problems

Dr. Katherine (Kat) Pankratz graduated with her veterinary degree from the University of Winsconsin-Madison in 2014 and pursued a small animal rotating internship in New York. She completed her behavioural medicine residency program at North Carolina State University and became board certified by the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists in 2018. She stayed on at NC State for her fellowship and as a clinical instructor before joining the Animal Behavior Clinic in Portland, Oregon, in 2019. She is an adjunct professor at NC State College of Veterinary Medicine and teaches veterinary behaviour to the public, veterinary students, and fellow veterinarians. For her research on the use of behavioural medication to improve the welfare of cats, she was awarded the RK Anderson ACVB Resident Award and JFMS Resident Best Paper Award.
