

Proposed Amendments to Bill C-246

The following amendments to Bill C-246 have been proposed by the sponsoring MP Nathaniel Erskine-Smith (Beaches—East York, Ontario) to address concerns brought forward by some organizations and members of the public.

- 1. Section 160 of the Criminal Code is amended by adding the following after subsection (3):(4) For the purposes of this section, bestiality means sexual activity between a person and an animal.
- 2. Section 445.1 of the Code amended as follows:
 - 445.1(1) Everyone commits an offence who
 - (b) in any manner encourages, promotes, receives money for, aids or assists at the fighting or baiting of animals or birds, including breeding, training or transporting an animal or bird to fight
- 3. A new section 445.2 be created. The Act is amended by adding the following after section 445.1:
 - 445.2 (1) Everyone commits an offence who
 - (a) negligently causes unnecessary pain, suffering or injury to an animal or a bird;
 - (b) being the owner, or the person having the custody or control of an animal or a bird, wilfully or recklessly abandons it or negligently fails to provide suitable and adequate food, water, air, shelter and care for it;

or

- (c) negligently injures an animal or a bird while it is being conveyed.
- (2) For the purposes of subsection (1), "negligently" means departing markedly from the standard of care that a reasonable person would use.
- (3) Everyone who commits an offence under subsection (1) is guilty of
 - (a) an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than two years; or
 - (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction and liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months or to both.
