1 How do you get involved?

Submit an image of a tick removed from a companion animal to the **eTick.ca** platform— it is free and easy to do!

HOW TO SUBMIT A TICK

Submitting tick images through **eTick.ca** provides photographic species identification.

2 If the tick is identified as *Ixodes* spp. you may receive a message to submit the tick to the **BCCDC Public Health Laboratory for pathogen testing** (so please, after you take the photo, **hold on to those ticks!**).

Requested tick specimens received by the BCCDC PHL will undergo **tick species confirmation and testing for pathogens.***

Encourage pet owners to bring in ticks they find on their pets.
